



Abdelaziz Adam Al-Hilu

Abdelaziz Adam Al-Hilu is a pivotal figure in Sudan's contemporary political and military landscape, combining decades of battlefield leadership with a clear political vision for restructuring the Sudanese state. Rooted in the Nuba Mountains and academically trained in economics at the University of Khartoum, he has built his career around the "New Sudan" project, anchored on two principles: secularism (the separation of religion and state) and the pursuit of justice and equal citizenship for marginalized regions.

Since joining the Sudan People's Liberation Movement (SPLM) in the mid-1980s, he has risen to become President of the SPLM–North and Commander-in-Chief of its army. Known as the "man of difficult missions" for his discipline and resilience, he has led both armed struggle and peace negotiations with unwavering commitment to his principles. Beyond his military command, Al-Hilu is also recognized for his intellectual clarity and advocacy for human rights, making him a decisive player in shaping Sudan's trajectory of war and peace for over three decades.
