



Mohamed Othman Al-Ta'aishi

A distinguished Sudanese politician and peace negotiator, recognized as one of the principal architects of the **Juba Peace Agreement (2020)**. As a member of Sudan's **Sovereign Council**, he successfully led the government delegation as **Chief Negotiator**, achieving a historic accord that ended decades of civil war. He later assumed senior executive responsibilities, chairing the **High Committee for Monitoring the Darfur Track** and the **High Committee for the National Governance Conference**, shaping Sudan's political future.

His journey spans from **grassroots leadership as President of the University of Khartoum Students' Union**, to **field engagement with displaced communities in Darfur**, to decision-making at the highest levels of the state.

He currently serves as **Senior Peace Researcher with the Public International Law & Policy Group (PILPG)**, leveraging his negotiation expertise and bilingual fluency in Arabic and English to advance **post-conflict constitution building and transitional justice** globally.
